Hubert Lamb Centenary meeting

The Society, together with the University of East Anglia and the Climatic Research Unit, is celebrating the Hubert Lamb Centenary with a two-day event, which will be attended by members of the Lamb family, on 6 and 7 September 2013 at the University of East Anglia. The meeting programme includes contributions from Phil Jones, Richard Cornes and Giles Foden (all from the University of East Anglia), Dennis Wheeler (University of Sunderland), Aryan van Engelen (Royal Netherlands Meteorological Institute), Kathleen Pribyl (University of Brighton), Astrid Ogilvie (Cicero, Norway, and the Stefansson Arctic Institute, Iceland) and Chris Folland (Met Office, Hadley Centre), as well as a visit to the Hubert Lamb Building (CRU) and an exhibition.

Amongst the topics covered will be: The Lamb Weather Types; Hubert Lamb's 'treasure trove': ships' logbooks and climate change; Storms and instrumental data; World War II meteorology and literature; Climate of the Low Countries, Past, Present and Future; Medieval documentary data sources from England; Documentary Historical Evidence for the Climate of Northern Europe in the Medieval Period, and Developments in UK and European seasonal forecasting since Hubert Lamb's time in the Met Office.
